Provincial EPR – A Snapshot

Product Categories regulated in accordance with Canadian Council of Ministers of Environment Canada-wide Action Plan for Extended Producer Responsibility (CAP-EPR)

Exponential growth: To date 14 product categories captured through 22 programs, making BC North American leader in advancing EPR policy

Packaging and Printed materials √ Mercury containing lamps √ Other mercury-containing products √ Electronics and electrical products √ Household hazardous and special wastes √ Automotive products √ CAP EPR Phase 2 Construction materials Demolition materials Furniture Textiles and carpet Appliances, including ozone-depleting substances (ODS) √



Provincial EPR – Current Challenges
