Preview site for signs of potential person in the bin ie: personal bag, cigarette butts, other personal items.



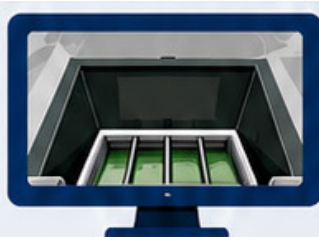

Create noise when approaching bins.



3

Raise bins 6-8 inches off the ground and shake slightly to arouse anyone in the bin, before tipping into hopper.



4

View tipping of materials in hopper camera (if available) to watch for any person being tipped into hopper.



5

Do not push the bin against a wall as there is a potential for a person sleeping behind the bin.



6

For you own personal safety, do not get out of truck to inspect a bin before tipping.



7

Report any incidents of persons found in waste bins to your supervisor.
